WILLIAM FRANCIS DRUMMOND JERVOIS, Major-General in Her Majesty's Army, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Province of South Australia and the Dependencies thereof, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, dedicate, in such manner as might seem best for the public interests, any Crown lands for any public building

(not being intended for ecclesiastical purposes): Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the provisions of the above recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the date hereof, be reserved and dedicated for public purposes for a Post Office and Telegraph Station at Farina Town, in addition to allotment 393 in said Town:—

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Comprising the whole of allotment 394, situate in Farina Town, Government Gums, and bounded on the north by the southern boundary of allotment 423; on the east by the western boundary of allotment 395; on the south by the northern side of First-street; and, on the west by the eastern boundary of allotment 393.
